1 in 8 Coloradans lives in Denver

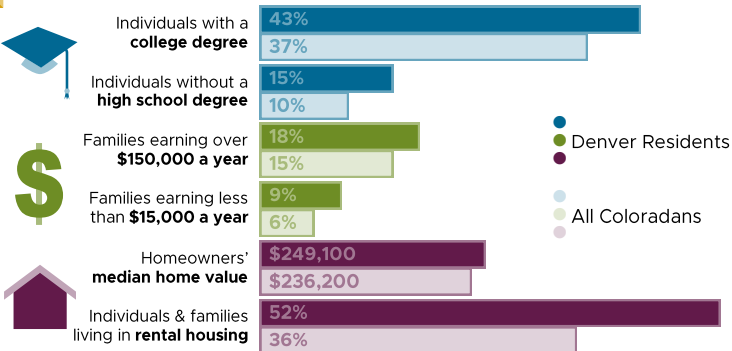
Population Density



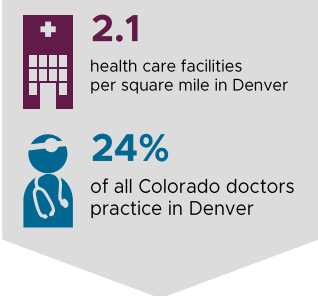
In 3 years, Denver's population density increased by almost 400 people per square mile



Some Denver residents are **doing very well** while others face **more difficult life circumstances**



Despite its many resources, Denver's health care system **isn't meeting all its residents' needs**



Among Denver residents:

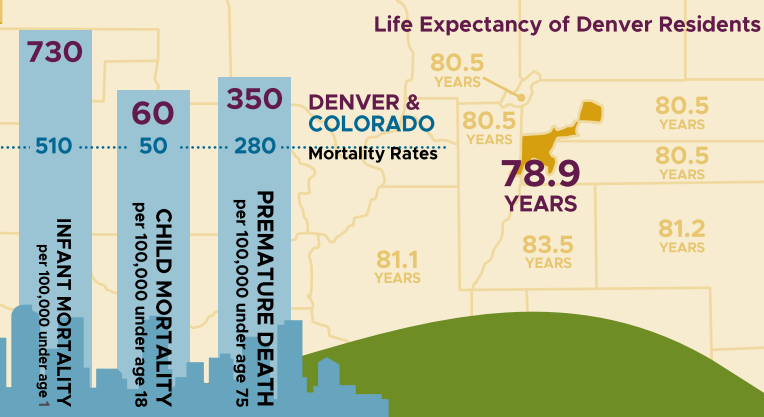
18% have no usual source of care compared to **13%** of Coloradans

54% went to an emergency room for non-urgent care compared to **40%** of Coloradans

10% are uninsured compared to **7%** of Coloradans



Of particular concern is the **increased risk of early death** for Denver residents



Despite having a more robust health care system than most of Colorado enjoys, many Denver residents are still in poor health. Together, we must work to understand and address the issues that are keeping residents from accessing care.
